# MRCH Childcare Programme

- The residential home at Epworth currently cares for 140 children: 60 boys and 80 girls, aged 3 to 18.
- Exciting developments are taking place with MRCH Community Based Orphan Care Schemes throughout the country. No less than 6092 children are benefiting from MRCH support, which includes provision of food, clothing, school uniforms, fees and support to foster parents.
- Development of a clinic "on-site" at Epworth. A qualified nurse has been hired to work in the clinic, which will be sited in the former Deputy's building.
- The estimated cost of setting this up is around £10,000. Money is required for medication, equipment and furniture.
- At the Executive Meeting it was agreed to send £5000 to go towards the set-up of the Clinic.
- A number of medical problems requiring immediate attention have been identified including conditions of the skin, eyes and ears and other illnesses associated with HIV and AIDS. Typical costs are £50 per child for a medical check-up and a test for HIV and £320 for examinations/scan for epilepsy.
- **Dietary Improvements**. Attempts are being made to improve the diet of the children at the Home but food remains scarce and expensive. To transform the children's diet will cost at least £1500 per month. *Our donations continue to be vital*.
- The Home continues to make progress in moving towards accommodating children in smaller **family groups**. Two such units are in operation with plans in hand for other units which will transform the lives of children at the Home.

# Forthcoming visit of Astonishment Summer 2005

Superintendant, Astonishment Mapurisa and his wife, Bridgitty will be visiting the UK this year for about 3 weeks from July 1st.

The **aims of the visit** will be to publicise the Home, increase understanding for our members and others as well as increased incentive to raise funds and to provide training for Aston by the NCH.

Aston will visit various NCH projects in different areas of the UK. Most probably he will visit Orpington, Surbiton, Bristol and York,. We would also like to provide the opportunity to visit some other places that he wasn't able to visit last time.

If anyone would like to **organise a meeting** in their local area, please let the Chairman know as soon as possible. They will need accommodation and transport to be arranged between venues.

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Transport costs can be re-imbursed if requested. We shall consider all requests, but please be aware that we must fit into a **tight schedule** and organised itinerary.

An itinerary will be sent out once it has been decided, so that everyone can attend any of the meetings in their area.

# Treasurer's Report Paddy Coles writes

**Good news!** We have had another very successful year of fundraising, which has produced £45,000.

Although this is £9,500 less than the previous year, this had been anticipated as in 2003 Southampton District Network had made it their project for the year and raised around £16,000.

We have remitted £47,000 to Matthew Rusike, the balance being out of our reserves.

Inflation is ever present in Zimbabwe, but thankfully this affects the exchange rate at about the same rate that it affects the local costs, therefore, whilst everything they buy costs more, they also get more Zim\$ for every £ we send.

The current exchange rate is around Z\$10-12000 = £1

The need to continue supporting the Home is as great as ever and in an attempt to give some support to children in the community, in addition to those in the Home, they need every penny we can send them.

**Many thanks** for your generous support over the last year. Many have raised funds in their local community and churches.

Please continue to do so! Whilst the Tsunami has heightened our awareness of the needs of those caught in the disaster, the needs of the children in Zimbabwe is ever present. Astonishment and the Staff at MRCH send their **grateful thanks** for all you do for them."

# **Christmas Cards**

**Thank you** to everyone who bought and sold cards and those who gave generous donations too. We did even better this year with a profit of around £3000, which will go directly to the Home. Once again, we are very grateful to NCH for paying the cost of postage.

Four of the new houses, funded by NCH are being used with one "Mother" and 10 children in each unit. The first two houses were basically furnished by the British Embassy in Harare. Other units still require basic furnishings, such as beds, chairs, storage units, curtains etc.
