Gift Aid

Our Gift Aid refund for tax year 2008/09 amounted to£3630.04. It was worth a bit of effort listing about 300 donations.

I am pleased to report that we are having a good year with our fundraising, and as a consequence I have been able to keep up regular fortnightly remittances to MRCH, in addition to funds sent for the building of the crèche. I should like to thank you all for the great efforts you have made. Those of you who were privileged to meet Astonishment and Bridgetv, when they were in England, will know that the need is a bottomless pit. They are able to touch a few thousand of the 1.4 million orphans in Zimbabwe, and at times this is with the sacrifice of their own salaries. In order to

give them more financial help than we do at present, we need to increase our supporters' base. So with this in mind we are enclosing a copy of our latest brochure, which we hope you can give to someone you feel may be interested in becoming a supporter/ member. In 1997 when we formed the Friends. our intention was to raise a small sum each year to give the children a few treats and in our first three years we raised just over £7000. In the next ten years we have raised another £450,000, which has been instrumental in keeping the Home open, and saving the lives of an unknown number of children. Your aenerous support is priceless.
