News from the Home

On November 18th we had another online meeting with Rev Linny Mutendzwa when he gave us an up date on life at MRCH.

Warm greetings from Zimbabwe.

Generally all the children are in good health and are going to school. The children taking public exams this month are making last minute efforts in their studies. There are no secondary children needing sponsors at the moment but 2 boys and 3 girls need sponsors to attend primary school.

On 4th October we bid farewell to another long serving house parent. Fungayi Mahlakapane popularly known as Mrs Tunha, retired after 27 years. It is very sad that she is retiring without a gratuity and with us still owing her US\$6000 salary as we continue trying to meet salary obligations. We hope this situation will improve early 2024 by an increase in government grants for 66 children placed at the Home without valid court orders. Children in care without court orders are not supported by government grants. We plan more fundraising activities, more partnerships at home and abroad and more income from more projects.

180 of the 200 targetted people attended the annual dinner dance in October and raised US\$6200, which is going towards staff salaries. We look forward to a better event next year.

Salaries cost US\$9000 per month. All levels of staff are owed 4 months salary including the Director and outreach staff.

Local Methodist Circuits and Districts now fund the 2 Outreach Centres at Donga and Mzinyathi, only the staff salaries are funded by MRCH at Epworth.

We are still waiting for the drilling company to deepen the borehole at Donga but there is no money left to install the pump, we are looking for quotes for the cost of installation.

The piggeries need new sows and feed, the poultry project was hit by a virus and we lost 200 chickens, we have since recovered. The two greenhouses produced a good crop of tomatoes many of which were sold.

Development plans Disruption to the children's education due to the deteriorating learning environment has made management realise they

must try to provide their own education establishment for the primary children. This will fill the gap between the ECD and the secondary school on site and was endorsed by the Methodist Conference.

We are engaging the Government Ministry of Primary and Secondary Education as we prepare to start our Primary school in January 2024. Using the existing infrastructure at the ECD centre we are able to enrol ECD A and B (4-6 yrs) and Grades 1&2 (6-8 yrs) We plan to build a new block each year. The school will be open to local children who will pay fees and our own residential children.

Fundraising plans

With new buildings needed over the next few years to accommodate the new school the Board is engaging in a recruitment drive locally and among the Zimbabwe Fellowship diaspora to raise funds for these new buildings and for the upkeep of the Home generally. **MRCH Associates** is the name chosen by the Board designed to publicise and campaign for desperately needed funds to keep the Home going in the serious economic situation in Zimbabwe.

This is a separate organisation from FoMRCH.
